Hydrogen is used to efficiently cool generators in power plants around the world.

The NTM SenseH₂™ hydrogen sensor has been designed to monitor the surrounding area for any hydrogen leaks and subsequent build up.

The NTM SenseH₂™ sensor can be connected to a ventilation system or air blowers so that when the hydrogen concentration reaches a certain level, the atmosphere can be diluted with air to protect equipment and ensure a safe working environment.

NTM SenseH₂™ hydrogen sensor is well suited for this application.....

- High sensitivity to hydrogen yet insensitive to other gases such as methane and carbon monoxide
- Accurate response in varying ambient flow environments, preventing false positive reporting
- Immune to signal saturation
- Robust, automotive grade, water-tight housing

**The NTM SenseH₂™ is calibrated in air and the calibration curve for the corresponding % hydrogen should only be applied for this type of atmosphere. The Sensor element needs oxygen in order to perform properly, 100% reducing environments will damage the sensor. **
